- We had a successful Michigan College Month during October! Seniors had the opportunity to work on college applications, begin their FAFSA, and check out some scholarships during English class.
- Every Thursday in October, we had College Trivia Thursdays where students could enter their
 guess to the trivia question for a chance to win a prize. Congratulations to Landon Butler, Emily
 Carlson, Cameron Jacobs, and Kyle Drauch, our winners throughout the month! We also wore
 college apparel every Friday during the month and teachers and staff talked about some of their
 college experiences.
- Although Michigan College Month is officially over, seniors can continue to apply to colleges, complete their FAFSA, and search for scholarships all year long!
- Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors had the chance to take practice PSAT and SAT testing during October. Their test results will be used by teachers in the classroom to focus on areas of improvement. Students can also connect their College Board account to Khan Academy for more practice before testing in the Spring.
- Our marking period ended last Friday, October 28th. We now enter marking period two which
 will end before exams in January. A reminder that marking period one, marking period two, and
 semester one exams all add up to the final semester one grade. Students should continue their
 success in each marking period and on the exam to receive a passing grade for the semester. We
 have Homework Hour Monday Thursday from 3 4PM to provide extra help and time to
 students who may benefit from it. Teachers may also assign students Homework Hour too.

- On Wednesday, November 9th, seniors will be taking a trip to Southwestern Michigan College

 after high school. If you do not want your student to attend this trip and attend their regular

- It's time to submit your college applications and FAFSA! The 2023-2024 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will be available for senior students to complete. Information is collected from 2021 tax information to determine financial aid awards. The initial state deadline is March 1. You can complete it anytime, but the sooner it is done, the more likely you are to receive financial aid. Start the FAFSA at (https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa). Remember, you should never pay to fill out the FAFSA. Please see Ms. Newell if you need help.
- If you want to request your high school transcript to be sent to a college/university, please use your Parchment account at parchment.com.
