### Curriculum

**Math** – Please work on math fluency throughout the school year. Students should master specific facts in  $1^{st} - 4^{th}$  grades which will help them be more successful in upper elementary and secondary math classes and life in general.

First Grade: Master Addition facts 0-20 Second Grade: Master Subtraction facts 0-20 Third Grade: Master Multiplication facts 0-20 Fourth Grade: Master Division facts 0-20

**Reading** – Students increase their vocabulary knowledge/usage and comprehension skills by reading at least 20 minutes each night. Parents/Guardians reading to their children is a great way to implement this as well. For older students you could have the child read a page and then a parent/guardian read a page.
