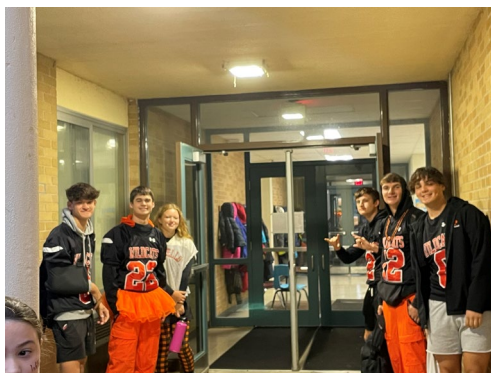
WAYS TO MAKE LEARNING

ENGAGING AT HOME- To help make learning engaging at home you can have students write their spelling or vocabulary words in whipped cream, shaving cream or a bag of hair gel. Like to be outdoors? Learn like Abraham Lincoln and write or compute in the dirt with a stick.

MATH – Students have been taking their beginning of the year benchmark assessments. Please work on math fluency throughout the school year.
