Introduction to Music Theory Marcellus High School 2022

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Welcome to Music Theory! This class is designed for students who seek to enrich their knowledge of the fundamentals of music. Whatever musical background students come from, music theory can be intriguing and inspiring (might even help your math skills)! By knowing how elements of music interact to create musical style and effect, students will truly better appreciate how music is brought to life and its ability to communicate to others.

Objectives:

- To develop knowledge and understanding of the concepts of music theory
- To develop music skills through understanding of all content areas

At the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Identify the following: Grand Staff, Time Signatures, Note and Rest values, Key Signatures, Clefs, Accidentals/Enharmonics, Intervals, Scales: Major, Minor and Chromatic, The Circle of Fifths, Triads: Major, Minor, Augmented, Diminished, Inversions, Dominant 7ths
- Define and understand basic music terms
- Read and notate melodies in Treble and Bass Clef
- Notate pitch and rhythm following standard notation practices
- Write Major and Minor Scales
- Recognize all intervals within an octave
- Recognize chord types
- Have a basic understanding of early Music History up to the Classic Era.

Required Course Materials:

- 1.5 inch or 2 inch, 3-Ring binder (see following page)
- Staff Paper (provided, or you can download some and print it)
- PENCILS (Music notation is a precise task which requires neatness.
 Assignments will only be given full credit if they are in pencil. <u>NO PENS</u> SHOULD BE USED AT ANY TIME!)

Grading Policy

A grade of "zero" will be issued for any missing assignments and will be marked clearly in Powerschool. The standard MHS grading scale will be used as indicated in the student handbook.

Music theory is a class which requires an evaluation of skills through written understanding of musical concepts, therefore the grade will be based on the following:

•	Homework and Classwork	25%
•	Written tests and quizzes	25%
•	Projects	20%
•	3-Ring Binder	15%
•	Participation	15%

Class assignments are given, collected, and graded in order to check your progress. Homework will be collected at the beginning of class on the due date unless otherwise specified. Late assignments will be accepted, HOWEVER, the grade value will be lowered 5 points everyday that it is passed due. If you are absent, please follow the student handbook guidelines regarding assignments. Extra credit work may be available periodically.

Keep it clean, neat, and well organized, decorate it for bonus points. You get the picture.
